Textiles Level I is the first step in the completion of the **Textile & Design Program of Study**. This program is for the student interested in pursuing a Career in Apparel Design & Production or gaining a practical life skill.

Textile classes are individualized and activity oriented. Daily lab performance is necessary to practice learning/s and observe teacher demonstrations. It is the student's responsibility to make sure he/she organizes his/her time each week so as to complete assignments on time. Writing will include weekly reflections, project reflections and a CRLE reflection.

PROJECT EXPECTATIONS:

All Sewing samples & projects must be completed at school!

All Cutting Layouts must be OK'ed prior to cutting.

All Projects must be OK'ed prior to purchase for suitability & rigor.

Choose project/s (5 weeks) that challenge ones level of sewing ability.

YOUR Project materials (pattern, fabric & thread) are due at school by the end of the 4th week.

Project/s must utilize a purchased pattern with yardage, cutting layouts, & sewing directions.

Graded project/s must utilize a purchased pattern and direction sheet.

(Pattern & construction changes may be made with teacher consultation.)



CLASS EXPECTATIONS:

Safely use and properly care for sewing machines and other equipment.

ASSIGNMENTS: (See trimester plan, on website, for assignment due dates.)

Technical Reading: Shopping Sheet, Cutting Layout, Pattern Envelope & Sewing Directions.

Sewing Projects: Community Service Project (3 weeks), Sewing Machine Project (3 weeks)

Sewing Samples: Cut/Mark/Interface, Trim/Over edge Seam, Waistline Casing, Machine Hem, Staystitch, Grade/Clip/Notch, Baste/Gather, Dart.

Fashion Textbook: Clothes & Fashion (Ch. 1-3), The Art of Apparel (Ch 10-12)

Writing: Weekly Performance Reflections, Project Reflection, CRLE Reflection.

Lab Performance: Safety, Sewing Technique, Clean-up & Maintenance.

Quizzes: Sewing Tools, Measurements, Pattern Envelope, Cutting Layout, Terminology, etc.

Tests/Quizzes: Sewing Machine License Test, Final Exam: Written & Sewing
