## PROJECT EXPECTATIONS:

**All Sewing samples & projects must be completed at school!**

**All Cutting Layouts must be OK'ed prior to cutting.**

**All Projects must be OK'ed prior to purchase for suitability & rigor.**

Choose a 5-week project that challenges your level of sewing ability beyond level 1 and incorporate the use of the Serger/Cover Stitch.

Students are responsible for bringing materials needed for their chosen project.

YOUR Project materials are due at school by the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> week.

Project/s must utilize a purchased pattern with yardage, cutting layouts, & sewing directions.

(Pattern & construction changes may be made with teacher consultation.)

## CLASS EXPECTATIONS:

Safely use and properly care for Sewing Machines/Sergers and other equipment.  
Read and abide by “Vetter Values”.

**Sewing Projects:** Community Service Project – Quilt Block, Stocking: Fill a Stocking Fill a Heart YOUR Sewing Machine /Serge Project

**Sewing Samples:** Understitching, serged seam, corners & curves, stretch hems, Flat Button w/Thread Shank, Buttonhole)

**Fashion Textbook:** The Science of Apparel (Ch 8&9), The Art of Apparel (Ch 10-12)

**Writing:** Daily Textile Lab Performance Journal, Project Reflection, CRLE Reflection.

**Lab Performance:** Safety, Sewing Techniques, Sewing Machine Maintenance, Work space Clean-up & supervision, Threading & use of the Serger/Cover Stitch machines.

**Tests & Quizzes:** Final Exam (Written & Sewing)

**ATTENDANCE:** (Refer to School Policy)

**Absences** – Get make-up work ASAP.

**Open Lab Make-up:** I will be available during 2<sup>nd</sup> lunch and by appointment after school.
